This event was hosted by the Heritage Chapter of the Freedom Through Vigilance Association, an active member of The EC-47 History Site Commemorative Partner Program committee. This successful ceremony was held to recognize, honor, and present lapel pins to Vietnam War-era veteran members of the Goodfellow Eagles Group, an organization of retired and active duty O-6 officers from all services. Attendance by the veterans and their families was greater than anticipated; additional tables and chairs had to be brought in to accommodate everyone. We especially appreciate the valued assistance from the Angelo State University West Texas Collection staff and the EC-47 History Site committee chairperson. The commemorative banner, proclamation, partner certificate, committee organizational posters, and other commemorative materials were displayed at the front of the room. The purpose of the ceremony, commemoration objectives, and the veteran lapel pin fact sheet were discussed prior to the presentation of the lapel pins. Vietnam War veteran, Ed Bendinelli, and JJ Graham, President of the Heritage Chapter, conducted the ceremony and "pinned" each recipient. In all, 16 lapel pins were presented: 14 to retired O-6s from the Army, Navy, and Air Force; one veteran Air Force Captain; and one retired Air Force senior noncommissioned officer. Each veteran was also presented a copy of the Commemoration of the 50th Anniversary of the Vietnam War Proclamation issued by the mayor of San Angelo, Texas. All of the recipients were very thankful for the recognition and the presentation ceremony. The pride was evident in the eyes of those receiving their pins and in those of the family members in attendance. There were more than a few tears shed.

After the presentation, we were approached by a veteran's spouse about speaking to the San Angelo Rotary Club members about what the Vietnam War Commemoration effort is all about. EC-47 ARDF veterans and Heritage Chapter officers Larry Ross (secretary) and Ed Bendinelli (vice president) agreed and gave a presentation to the club on Sept. 9. This was an informative meeting only, and no presentations were made. A number of Vietnam War-era veterans were in attendance and expressed interest in participating in future recognition events. The day after the August 30, 2016 EC-47 History Site Commemoration Partner ceremony at the San Angelo Country club where Heritage Chapter President J.J. Graham and I recognized and pinned 15 Vietnam War-era veterans, I received a call from Mrs. Margaret Charlesworth. Margaret is the wife of retired dermatologist Ernie Charlesworth, one of the retired O-6s we honored at the August 30th event. Margaret was truly impressed by the Eagles Group ceremony and by the very notion that Vietnam War vets are finally being recognized. She asked if I could give a presentation to the San Angelo Rotary Club about the Vietnam War Commemoration effort at its September 9th breakfast meeting. Margaret told me that she knew of one Vietnam War veteran in her Rotary club. Well! The very first person I met at the meeting was Vietnam War veteran Mr Pat Mallory, Rotary Club President. He wasn't the veteran Margaret had told me about. Capt (USN, Ret) John Jones was also there. Capt Jones is also one of the O-6s we pinned on the 30th. The Vietnam War veteran that Margaret did have in mind was John Baggett, who also attended the breakfast meeting. It was a small group, with about 14 Rotarians, Heritage Chapter Secretary/Treasurer/Photographer Larry Ross and myself. The San Angelo Rotary Club has 16 members...a 90% membership attendance at this meeting. I gave about a 15-20 minute presentation about the United States of America Vietnam War Commemoration and the role of the Commemorative Partners. After the formal presentation, I answered several questions, told some war stories and passed out brochures. I did note the phone numbers of Mr Mallory and Mr Baggett who are very interested in participating in a future commemoration ceremony. All in all, I think it was a worthwhile event--educating more San Angeloans about this program to honor and thank all Vietnam War-era veterans for their courageous service.
