This tribute to USAFSS Vietnam War-era veterans ceremony was conducted as part of the regularly scheduled monthly meeting/quarterly family social of the Heritage Chapter membership. In addition to the Heritage Chapter regular members, 5 special guests attended. They were: from San Antonio, Texas, Vietnam War veterans, retired USAF Chief Master Sergeant Ken Gendolfe and Mrs. Carole Gendolfe, and the 25th Air Force Chaplain, Colonel Bruce Glover and Mrs. Carol Glover. Chaplain Glover opened the evening with a very patriotic, veterans and family oriented Invocation. Also, Mr. 'Kid' Wongsrichanalai, assistant professor of History at Angelo State University, attended and presented information about his work with the history department *War Stories: West Texans from World War I to the Present* project. He invited all Heritage Chapter members to participate. Special guests from Goodfellow AFB included Connie Morales-Piper, the Field Studies Program Manager, and Joe Dube, the International Military Student Office Chief for the International Intelligence Officers Applications Course. Ten allied country military officers also attended.

Tom Nurre, Heritage Chapter member and chairman of The EC-47 History Site VWC Partner Program committee, presented prepared comments and a video of VWC ceremonies. The video included the Joe Galloway introduction of the VWC program, Secretary of Defense comments made during the July 8, 2015 Congressional Ceremony, and the video clip of the Speaker of the House introduction of the VWC lapel pin. Immediately following the video, the Heritage Chapter president and vice-president, retired Chief Master Sergeants JJ Graham and Ed Bendinelli, presented a VWC lapel pin and the Heritage Chapter Certificate of Honor to 6 Vietnam War-era veterans. 

October 11, 2015

Story line narrative by Ed Bendinelli—

At the October meeting of the Heritage Chapter, I told the members about my very good friend, Jim Fennell. Jim is a retired chiropractor who moved here from Arizona in 1992 with his wife Pat to take over management of Trudo's Religious Store in San Angelo. Jim served in the USAF, both active and reserve, from 1955-1963. In September 2013, after undergoing carotid artery surgery, Jim suffered a massive stroke and, except for slight movement of his head and right arm, he has remained permanently and completely paralyzed since that day. As members of the EC-47 History Site Vietnam War Commemorative Partnership committee, I asked the Chapter for its support in thanking and "pinning" Jim in recognition of his service. The Chapter agreed and, on October 11th, Chapter members Tom Nurre, Larry Miller, Larry Ross and myself visited Jim and his wife Pat at the Park Plaza Nursing home and honored a beaming Jim, who never stopped smiling the whole time we were there. Tom presented Jim with a new EC-47 Challenge Coin. I told Tom later that an hour after everyone else had left, Jim was still smiling and still holding on to that coin. I hadn't seen him smile that much in two years.
