This was a coordinated Vietnam War Commemoration (VWC) event co-sponsored by the San Angelo Vietnam Veterans of America (VVA), Chapter 457 and The EC-47 History Site, both registered Commemorative Partners. Both organizations worked well together coordinating plans, making posters, and assigning primary tasks. Unfortunately the chilly temperatures and gusty winds did not allow a complete program set up. See VVA Chapter 457 report on next page. The EC-47 History Site CPP committee chairman, Tom Nurre, was the event speaker. Heritage Chapter -FTVA and Angelo State University West Texas Collections and History Department committee members also participated in this event. They greeted and welcomed all veterans and their families. . . and distributed copies of the VWC commemorative lapel pin fact sheet. Vietnam War veteran and community photographer, Mr. Bruce Foreman, took the attached photos. The program included the dedication of several memorial pavers by the VVA, followed by the guest speaker comments and presentation of lapel pins. Nurre explained the 50th VWC program, the actions and responsibilities of the participating commemorative partners, and the significance of honoring these veterans with the commemorative lapel pin. The program concluded with the speaker calling forward all eligible Vietnam War-era veterans who were applied and thanked for their service. valor and sacrifice. The President of VVA Chapter 457, Mr. Perry Stevens, and Chapter 457 Treasurer, Mr. Tony Graf, presented the lapel pins. JJ Graham and Ed Bendinelli of the Heritage Chapter, Shannon Sturm of the West Texas Collections, and Christine Lamberson from the History Department, congratulated all lapel pin recipients and presented each with a Certificate of Honor, a proclamation signed by the San Angelo Mayor, and a brochure and invitation to participate in the History Department "War Stories" project. VVA and The EC-47 History Site committee members stayed after the ceremony and enjoyed conversations and story telling with the Vietnam War veterans and their families. With due respect to the San Angelo School District, multiple schools (elementary/middle/high) had coordinated their Veterans Day programs very early and effectively obligated the Mayor and general public to ceremonies that conflicted with this VVA program schedule. None-the-less, a former mayor and the thirty-five Vietnam War-era veterans and their families, as well as all those who attended, especially appreciated the commemoration ceremony and the individual recognition and welcome home sentiment. The EC-47 History Site committee will continue to work with the VVA Chapter 457 leadership with aim to make this an annual VWC event.
